Pupil Exclusions: This committee is in place but members are invited by the Chair of Governors as appropriate e.g. the staff governors would not be present; a Governor would not be present if it was their child. The panel who hear the exclusion are excluded from hearing the appeal. The Chair of Governors always sits on the appeal panel.

Staff Disciplinary: This is often made up of members form the personnel committee and others as required. The panel who hear the disciplinary are excluded from hearing the appeal. The Chair of Governors usually sits on the appeal panel.

## What do we do?

St Joseph's Catholic Primary Schools are served by a Governing Body of 14 members, operating via an instrument of government.

Governing Bodies have a strategic role in the development of the school but do not become involved in day-to-day management issues – that is the role of the Executive Headteacher and Heads of Schools.

The Governing Body is accountable, on behalf of the Catholic community and the community of the school; the Governing Body decides what it wants the schools to achieve, in order to secure its mission, and sets the framework for making sure those intentions are realised.
